



SUPPLEMENTAL PROCLAMATION NO. 1 TO THE PROCLAMATION AND DECLARATION OF EMERGENCY DATED APRIL 7, 2020

WHEREAS, the Town of Dewey-Humboldt (the "Town") continues to respond to the spread of the coronavirus 2019 ("COVID-19") and working with federal, state, and local governmental authorities and with schools, businesses, non-profits, medical facilities, and faith groups within the Town to combat and reduce the spread of the COVID-19 outbreak and to assist the community and its citizens with the effects of the COVID-19 outbreak; and,

WHEREAS, the World Health Organization declared a Public Health Emergency of International Concern on January 30, 2020, the United States Department of Health and Human Services declared a Public Health Emergency related to the COVID-19 outbreak on January 31, 2020, and the World Health Organization officially declared a pandemic due to COVID-19 on March 11, 2020; and,

WHEREAS, the Governor of the State of Arizona, Douglas A. Ducey, on March 11, 2020, declared that a State of Emergency exists in Arizona due to the COVID-19 outbreak and determined that the COVID-19 outbreak presents conditions that are, or are likely to be, beyond the control of services, personnel, equipment, and facilities of any single county, city, or town, and which requires the combined efforts of the State of Arizona and the political subdivisions; and,

WHEREAS, the President of the United States of America, Donald J. Trump, on March 13, 2020 found and proclaimed that the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States constitutes a national emergency; and,

WHEREAS, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, President Donald J. Trump, and the Arizona Department of Health Services have issued multiple recommendations to combat or reduce the spread of the COVID-19 outbreak, which include recommendations on avoiding social gatherings and the postponement of certain in-person events; and,

WHEREAS, Governor Ducey on March 30, 2020, issued Executive Order No. 2020-18, Stay Home, Stay Healthy, Stay Connected, in which all Arizonans are authorized to leave their place of residence only for Essential Activities, to participate in or receive Essential Government Functions, or to participate in or fulfill Essential Functions, all of which are defined in various Executive Orders; and,


WHEREAS, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statute (A.R.S.) § 26-311 and Dewey-Humboldt Code of Ordinances § 30.031, on April 7, 2020, I, Terry Nolan, Mayor of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt, declared a local emergency within the corporate limits of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt, and set forth regulations to preserve the peace and order of the Town; and,

WHEREAS, all provisions of the Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency issued on April 7, 2020, will remain in full force and effect through April 30, 2020.


NOW, THEREFORE, I, Terry Nolan, Mayor of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt, Yavapai County, State of Arizona, pursuant to A.R.S. § 26-301, et. seq., and Dewey-Humboldt Code of Ordinances § 30.031, do hereby proclaim and order that:

1. Dewey-Humboldt Code of Ordinances, Chapter 30, § 30.101, Regular Meetings, and § 30.102 is hereby temporarily suspended for the sole purpose of canceling the Study Session that would otherwise have been held on April 14, 2020 and allowing the cancelled Town Council Regular Meeting of April 7, 2020, to be held on April 14, 2020.
2. All provisions of the original Proclamation and Declaration of Emergency dated April 7, 2020, shall remain in full force and effect through April 30, 2020.
3. This Supplemental Proclamation No. 1 shall be effective immediately.
