We are nearing completion on the TH and it's looking great. I installed the horse gate and the OHV cattle Guard yesterday and the welders are going to be finishing up the fence Monday or Tuesday next week. The attached picture shows the trailhead with 4 fire engines, 4 trucks, plus my big truck and trailer parked randomly, with plenty of room to spare. There was a smoke report in the area, so this was a great place to stage from, turned out to be a false alarm. (See picture)

I envision a 4 hour work session followed by the opening ceremony if that's what you all want to do. We have numerous signs to install, some requiring concrete and such. Green Gulch Trailhead Volunteer Day and Opening Ceremony

Saturday, September 10th

Come join in the fun with the Town of Dewey-Humboldt and the Prescott National Forest for Completion of the Green Gulch Trailhead

WHEN: Meet at 8am at Green Gulch. We will work from 8am – 11:30am and then we will have lunch and beverages provided by the Town of Dewey-Humboldt. Opening Ceremony will start at 1pm.

WHERE: Green Gulch Trailhead. Site is located west of HWY 69 at Dewey AZ. Approximately 18 miles south of Prescott, AZ. From HWY 69 at the Gas station, turn west on E. Kachina Pl., then left on S. Pony Pl. and right on E. Henderson Rd. Continue on this road, (which changes name into E. Newtown Ave.) to the end at the Forest Service boundary. From HWY 69 to site is approximately 3 miles.

WHO: All interested members of the public and current volunteers. Participants need to come prepared with long pants and sleeves, boots, and eye protection, and other personal items. Bring gloves if you have your own or the FS will provide. The Forest Service will bring all the tools and hard hats.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION: We will be working on the finishing touches of the Green Gulch TH, installing signs, information panel, and generally making the area ready for public use (authorized through the Greater Prescott Trails Plan).
