2020 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Everyday Dewey — Humboldt volunteers generously give their time and service to help others. Now here is your chance to give back by nominating a deserving individual for his/her outstanding service through the Town's Volunteer of the Year program.

Who is eligible?: The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2020. Nominees need to have been volunteers as individuals or for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. State the Nominee's name, what work has been done as a volunteer and/or the volunteer organization where the Nominee volunteered. Briefly describe why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Each Nominee should be submitted on a separate form. Nominations can be delivered to Town Hall via in person, USPS, emailed to bethevans@dhaz.gov or faxed to 928-632-7365. **The deadline for submissions is June 30, 2021.**

Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appointed the following individuals to the Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make recommendations to the Town Council: Jason Chisholm, Terry Nolan, Denise Rogers, Connor Snodgrass and Doug Treadway. Mayor Hughes will be

the Council's liaison with the Citizen Committee and will serve on the committee as an arbitrator only. Nominees will be judged on the service performed/donated by the nominee; the amount of time and effort spent by the nominee; whether the nominee was nominated for more than one service; and, whether the nominee was nominated by more than one person for their service. After review of the nominations, the Citizen Committee will make their recommendation to the Council.

Recognition: The Honoree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along with all that have been nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council at an upcoming Town Council meeting where they will be awarded certificates of appreciation. Nominees' guests and other dignitaries will be able to express their appreciation for the Nominee. The Volunteer of the Year plaque will be updated with the Honoree's name and date. This plaque is displayed in Town Hall. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.

OPEN SPACE AND TRAILS ADVISORY COMMITTEE (STANDING)

The Town needs volunteers to participate as Executive Members and Associate Members of the Open Space and Trails (OSAT) Advisory Committee (Standing). The Committee has a Master Plan that serves as the basis for the physical creation of trails, trailheads and other recreational opportunities within the Town. Copies of the Open Space and Trails Master Plan are available at the Town Hall and online at www.dhaz.gov.

The meetings of the Standing Committee will be subject to Arizona Open Meeting Law and will be conducted under Robert's Rules of Order. The day and time of the meetings are to be

determined. The committee will be responsible to report to the Town Council on a regular basis. Only Executive Members will have the ability to vote on matters before the Committee. However, Associate Members may participate in discussions and with the preparation of the meeting agendas.

To be eligible as an Executive Member you must be a resident of Dewey-Humboldt and willing to serve a term of two years. The terms of Associate Members will be indefinite and they may reside anywhere.

If you have an interest in participating, but also have questions, you can call the Community Development Director, Steven Brown, at 928-632-7362. To be considered, you will need to submit a completed Vacancy Application Form to Town Hall. Vacancy forms are available online at www.dhaz.gov or at Town Hall. The final selection and appointment for these positions will be made by the Town Council.

2018 BUILDING CODES ADOPTED

After several Town Council meetings and input from the public, the 2018 International Building Codes Ordinance 21-159 has been passed and adopted on April 20, 2021. Except for emergency measures, ordinances, resolutions and franchises become effective 30 days after its passage by the Council and signature by the Mayor. FY 2021-2022 BUDGET TO BE ADOPTED SOON



The Fiscal Year 2021-2022 begins on July 1, 2021. The Fiscal Year 2021-22 Tentative Budget is scheduled to be adopted by

Council at the June 1st meeting. The hearing and the adoption of the Final FY 2021-22 Budget is scheduled for the June 22nd Council Meeting.

Council Meetings are held at Town Hall located at 2735 S. Highway 69, Humboldt at 6:30 p.m. The schedule is tentative at this point.

FIRE PREPAREDNESS TIPS

- Clear leaves and other debris from gutters, eaves, porches and decks. This prevents embers from igniting your home.
- Remove dead vegetation and other items from under your deck or porch, and within 10 feet of the house.
- Screen or box-in areas below patios and decks with wire mesh to prevent debris and combustible materials from accumulating.
- Remove flammable materials within 30 feet of your home's foundation and outbuildings, including garages and sheds. If it can catch fire, don't let it touch your house, deck or porch.
- Wildfire can spread to treetops. Prune trees so the lowest branches are 6 to 10 feet from the ground.
- Keep your lawn hydrated and maintained. If it is brown, cut it down to reduce fire intensity. Dry grass and shrubs are fuel for wildfire.
- Don't let debris and lawn cuttings linger. Dispose of these items quickly to reduce fuel for fire.
- Inspect shingles or roof tiles. Replace or repair those that are loose or missing to prevent ember

penetration.

- Cover exterior attic vents with metal wire mesh no larger than 1/8 inch to prevent sparks from entering the home.
- Enclose under-eave and soffit vents or screens with metal mesh to prevent ember entry.
- Use fire-resistant materials to build, renovate, or make repairs.
- Sign up for your community's warning system. The Emergency Alert System (EAS) and National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) Weather Radio also provide emergency alerts.
- Know your community's evacuation plans and find several ways to leave the area. Look for shelter locations and designate a meeting place. Practice driving the evacuation routes with everyone in your home. Have a plan for pets and livestock.
- Assemble an emergency supply kit and place it in a safe spot. Remember to include important documents, medications, personal identification and include N95 respirator masks to help you breathe. Keep in mind each person's specific needs, including and updated asthma action plan and medication. Don't forget the needs of pets.
- Designate a room that can be closed off from outside air. Close all doors and windows. Set up a portable air cleaner to keep indoor pollution levels low when smoky conditions exist.
- Keep important documents in a fireproof, safe place. Create password-protected digital copies.
- Review insurance coverage to make sure it is enough to replace your property.

Even driveways require a permit once they enter the Public Right of Way. The purpose of the permitting requirement is to protect the safety and welfare of your property and the community.

If you are planning to do work on or around your house, please contact Town Hall with project details first. Town Staff will help you determine any permitting requirements. Taking this simple step may prevent unexpected cost and headaches for all concerned parties during your improvement project.

SPRING CHIP SEAL OVERLAY PROJECT

Over the next 30 days, the Public Works Department will begin the annual **Spring Chip Seal Overlay Project**. The project will entail a chip overlay of existing roads throughout town with a fog (a thin liquid oil) coating once the chips are applied. There will be two crews working on this project, the crack seal crew and the chip seal crew.

There will be message boards on **Kachina Place, 169 & Foothill Drive and possibly Lazy River Drive** to do the roads of **Henderson Road; Newtown Avenue; Cranberry Road; Sleepy Acre Lane; Bradshaw Road; and Foothill Drive** for three days prior to the scheduled work.

Please note the days that are scheduled and have the roads free of parked vehicles.

Please anticipate minor delays and watch out for equipment and personnel while driving in these areas.
