Free COVID-19 Testing: YCCHS is offering free COVID-19 testing in Prescott Valley and Cottonwood.
Prescott Valley: **Date:** Every Tuesday and Thursday **Time:** 1:00 pm-5:30 pm. **Location:** Humboldt Unified School District Office, 6411 N. Robert Road, Prescott Valley
Cottonwood: **Date:** Tuesdays and Thursdays (Through Feb. 1, 22). **Time:** 10 am-12pm **Location:** Cottonwood Fire Station, 199 S. 6th Street. Drive through testing will be set up at the entrance of the parking lot off East Aspen Street and existing onto S. 6th Street.

Yavapai County reports 1,262 COVID-19 Cases and 17 Deaths since Monday, January 10, 2022. The county has tested 123,057 residents for COVID-19 in the past 6 months, and there have been 39,484 positive cases and 1,011 deaths since the beginning of the pandemic. Yavapai Regional Medical Center reports **52** COVID-patients, VVMC reports **20** patients, and the VA reports **6** patients. The County is still experiencing high transmission of COVID-19 with a **24.6%** positivity rate and 664 cases per 100,000 residents for the week ending January 2, 2022. If you are experiencing symptoms of COVID-19 or what seems to be a bad cold, please get tested for COVID-19 and/or Flu. **ADHS COVID-19 Hotline – (844) 542-8201** (select Option number Eight) – help in English and Spanish from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. seven days a week, except for major holidays.
