2021 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR

Everyday Dewey-Humboldt volunteers generously give their time and service to help others. Now here is your chance to give back by nominating a deserving individual for his/her outstanding service through the Town's Volunteer of the Year program.

Who is eligible?: The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2021. Nominees need to have been volunteers as individuals or for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. State the Nominee's name, what work has been done as a volunteer and/or the volunteer organization where the Nominee volunteered. Briefly describe why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Each Nominee should be submitted on a separate form. Only one nomination per submission please. Nominations can be delivered to Town Hall via in person, U.S.P.S., emailed to bethevans@dhaz.gov or faxed to 928-632-7365. **The deadline for submissions is Thursday, June 30, 2022 at 6:00 p.m.**

Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appoints a Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make recommendations to the Town Council, who then decides whether to accept the recommendation. The Citizen Committee shall be comprised of a diverse group of individuals/organizations who are involved in the community. Members do not have to be a Dewey-Humboldt resident. Mayor John Hughes will be the Council's liaison with the Citizen Committee and will serve on the committee as an arbitrator only. Nominees will be judged on the outstanding service performed/donated by the nominee to the citizens of Dewey-Humboldt. This includes the amount of time and effort spent by the nominee; whether the nominee was nominated for more than one service; and, whether the nominee was nominated by more than one person for their service.

Recognition: The Honoree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along

with all that have been nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council at an upcoming Town Council meeting where they will be awarded certificates of appreciation. Nominees' guests and other dignitaries will be able to express their appreciation for the Nominee. The Volunteer of the Year plaque will be updated with the Honoree's name and date. This plaque is displayed in Town Hall. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.

STAGE 2 FIRE RESTRICTION

Effective May 26, 2022 8:00 a.m.

- **NO** residential burn permits issued
- Use of model rockets **PROHIBITED**
- Fireworks **PROHIBITED** except by approval of pyrotechnics permit.
- **NO** smoking outside of vehicles, outside of residential yards, or outside of designated smoking areas.
- **NO** outdoor use of firearms
- Welding, cutting, and grinding is **PROHIBITED**. Permission may be granted under special circumstances and repair situations as approved by the Fire Marshal.
- Chain saws are allowed with a spark arrestor, water or fire extinguisher, and a fire watch.
- Warming fires or camp fires, as well as charcoal and wood burning barbeques (ash and ember producing) **ARE PROHIBITED** in all locations. This also prohibits other open flame devices such as tiki lamps.
- The use of propane or natural gas barbecue cooking grills and fire pits **MAY BE USED** as long as they are constantly attended, are in an enclosed device, & can be turned off.

NATIONAL PET PREPAREDNESS MONTH

Check out these tips of how to prepare for your pets during an emergency:

1. Never leave them in an evacuation! If you are unable to make it home to evacuate, be sure you have a family member or friend on standby who has a house key and can evacuate your pet for you. If you are home and know you will need to evacuate, do so early to prevent risk of having to leave pets behind.
2. Make sure your pet ID Tags are up to date and/or your pet is microchipped so that they can be reunited with you in an emergency.
3. Make a plan for emergency housing of your pet. Find out where temporary housing is set up for pets if you have to evacuate - resources like Animal Disaster Services, veterinary centers, animal shelters, pet friendly hotels/motels, and family or friends' homes.
4. Create a Grab & Go Pet Supply Kit with 3 days of food and water, current (non-expired) medications, bowls, can opener (if-needed for wet food), flashlight, collar/leash, litter box, waste disposal items (trash bags, paper towel, gloves), comfort items (toys, blankets, bedding, hot and cold sources, etc.), an airtight water proof container with a recent photo with you and your pet, pet description, copy of medical records (vaccines), copy of adoption record, emergency release form, microchip information, contact information for yourself, your vet, and an out-of-town friend. Store these items in a ready to go bag in a cool and dry place.
5. Designate a backup caregiver for your pet should something happen to you.

VACANCY**

The Town has two vacancies on the Planning and Zoning Advisory Commission and is looking for two Dewey-Humboldt citizens to become Commissioners. Additionally, there is one vacancy for the Board of Adjustment.

One Planning and Zoning Advisory Commission vacancy would fulfill a term until July 15, 2025—just about 3 years. At that time, the Commissioner could be reappointed for a term of four years. The second vacancy would be a full four-year term appointment. The Board of Adjustment vacancy would fulfill a 4 year term.

If you would like to be considered for appointment to either position, please obtain and complete an application from the Town.

The Mayor and Town Council will review the applications, select a number of candidates and decide on the candidate to be appointed.

READY SET GO



Ready, Set, Go! is a nationwide program adopted by the 15 Arizona Sheriffs that educates residents about proactive measures to take before an emergency and actions to follow when communities are threatened.

The three steps encourage Arizonans to get **READY** by preparing now for what threatens their community, be **SET** by maintaining awareness of significant danger and to **GO**, evacuate immediately when the danger is current and life-threatening.

READY – Prepare Now

Be aware of the hazards that can threaten your community.

Take steps now to prepare for seasonal threats.

Register with your county/tribal emergency notification system.

Connect with your local emergency management office, sheriff's office and public health department on social media.

Make a family evacuation and communication plan that includes family phone numbers, out-of-town contacts and family meeting locations.

Build an emergency **Go** kit with enough food, water and necessary supplies for at least 72 hours. Include supplies to help keep you and your family healthy, such as face coverings, hand sanitizer and sanitizing wipes. Start with the five **P's; People and Pet Supplies, Prescriptions, Papers, Personal needs and priceless items.**

Check with your neighbors, family, friends and elders through video chats or phone calls to ensure they are **READY.**

Keep up to date on local news, weather watches, and weather warnings

SET – Be Alert

Know there is significant danger in your area.

Residents should consider voluntarily relocating to a shelter or with family/friends outside the affected area.

Grab your emergency **Go** kit.

Keep in mind unique needs for your family or special equipment for pets and livestock.

Stay aware of the latest news and information from public safety and public health officials.

This might be the only notice you receive. Emergency services cannot guarantee they will be able to notify everyone if conditions rapidly deteriorate. **Be SET to GO.**

GO! – Evacuate

Danger in your area is imminent and life threatening.

Residents should evacuate immediately to a shelter or with family/friends outside of the affected area.

If you choose to ignore this advisement, you must understand emergency services may not be able to assist you further.

Follow instructions from emergency personnel, stay on designated evacuation routes and avoid closed areas.

ADEQ UPDATE

In 2019 the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) applied a dust-control cover called Posi-Shell® over waste material called dross on the north end of the former Humboldt Smelter property. Posi-Shell® forms a thick, crusty layer that prevents dusty materials underneath from blowing. The Arizona Department of Environmental Quality (ADEQ), in cooperation and concurrence with EPA, has now laid down a fresh and thicker application of the Posi-Shell® dust-control cover to extend the life of the cover and reduce further weathering. ADEQ will provide a status update about this activity, as well as some other property-related safety projects, on their webpage at <https://azdeq.gov/dh-stack-project>.

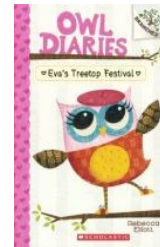
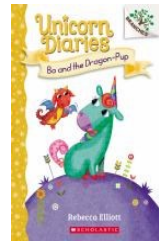
