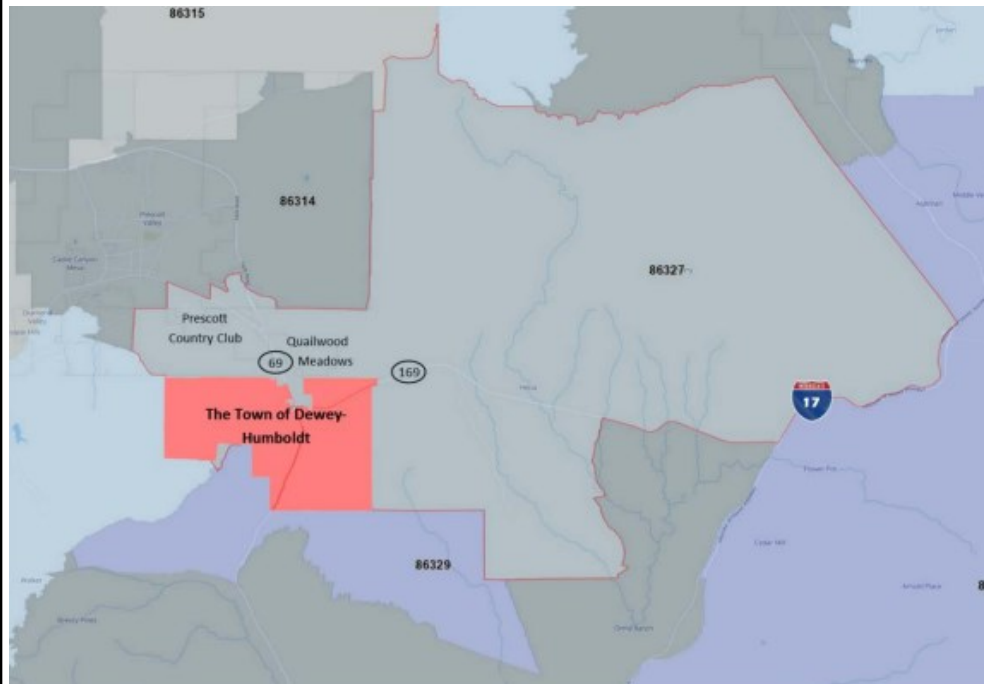
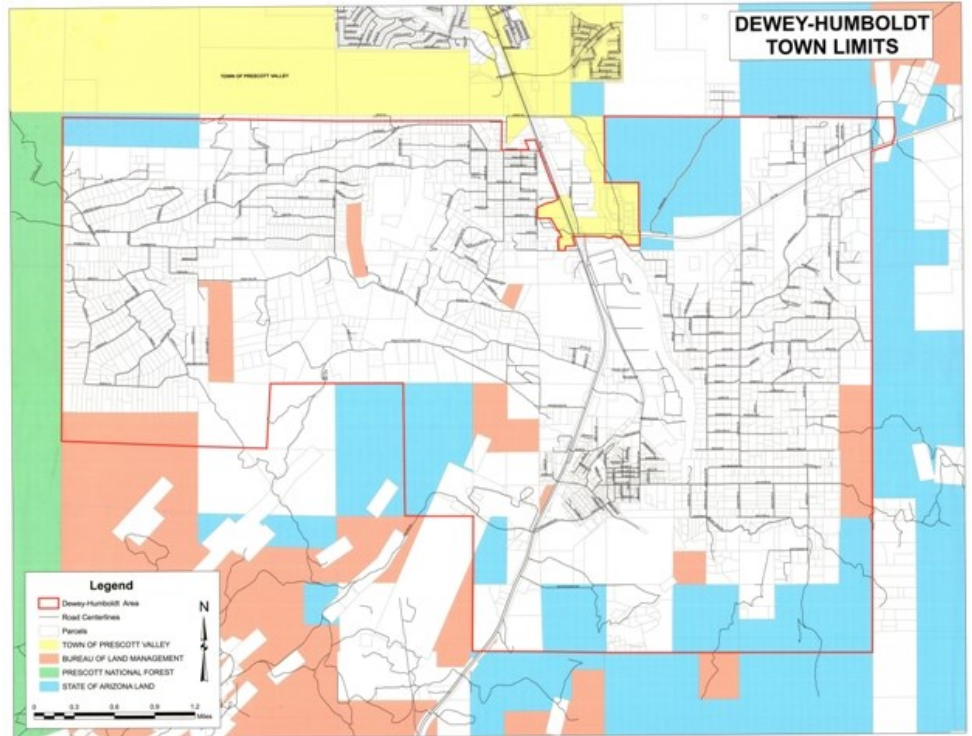

TOWN BOUNDARIES VS. ZIP CODES

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt is composed of 18.9 square miles and has a population of 4,326 (2020 census). There are two zip codes assigned to the Town (86327 Dewey & 86329 Humboldt) The maps (pictured to the right) give an approximate depiction of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt. The 86327 and 86329 zip codes cover just over 236 square miles and have a population of well over 10,000. A vast majority of the two zip codes are located within the unincorporated areas of Yavapai County. Neighborhoods and Subdivisions such as Prescott Country Club, White Horse Ranch, and Cherry all have an 86327 zip code and are all under Yavapai County's jurisdiction. The Villages at Lynx Creek, Orchard Ranch RV Park, and the Quailwood Meadows RV Park are all assigned the 86327 zip code, but are in the Town of Prescott Valley. TRUNK OR TREAT

WASHES, CHANNELS, DITCHES, CULVERTS, BRIDGES, & DRAINAGE EASEMENTS: KEEP YOUR WATERWAYS CLEAR!

Please **keep your waterways clear** to prevent clogged or plugged culverts. Homeowners have a responsibility to clean and maintain washes, drainage channels, and culverts running through their property. This means clean and clear of trash, debris, sediment, brush, overgrown choking or clogging vegetation, dead vegetation, and free of obstructions or structures. Walls and no climb fences **should not** be placed where they cross washes. Stop walls at the edge of the drainage easement or the channels flood plain and leave the wash area as common open space. If this can't be done, flood gates should be designed by a professional. Avoid locating any bridges, even decorated footbridges, over washes that originate upstream offsite from your property. Homemade or improperly designed or installed culverts and bridges can be disastrous for the homeowner, the neighbors, and adjacent streets. A culvert or bridge will generally alter the flow characteristics of the wash and should be designed by a professional. Washes **must not** be filled in, plugged or altered in any way to prevent changing the flow of the waterways. The purpose of keeping these areas clean is to maintain an unobstructed conveyance of storm water without impeding or reducing the water carrying capacity of the wash or channel. Everything in the waterways rushes downstream. If the culverts are clogged or homeowners have changed the flow of water on their property, this affects property owners below them causing flooding and property damage. Please think about how your waterways will affect your neighbors. The citizens of the town Thank you! Additionally, **it is the property owner's responsibility to maintain driveways of rock and sediments entering the roadways.** Contact the Town of Dewey-Humboldt before beginning any work within the public right-of-way, as a permit may be required.

SPECIAL ELECTION NEWS

The Town of Dewey-Humboldt is holding a special election on the November 8th General Election. The election is to vote to fill one seat on the Town Council with a two-year term.

PROPOSITION 457:

In addition to the Council Member seat, Proposition 457 will be on the November 8th ballot.

Proposition 457 is a citizen initiative to "amend Town Code 30.015, 'Town Council Generally' to require a supermajority vote (three quarters) of the Council Members instead of a simple majority vote on a loan for non-point source project, and other water or sewer loans for Town owned utilities from WIFA (Water Infrastructure Finance Authority) or any other source. This is necessary because current state law (ARS 9-571, C., 2) doesn't require the citizens to vote to approve such Council actions on a WIFA loan of towns our size."

More information, and pro and con arguments, on Proposition 457 will be published in a Publicity Pamphlet then posted on the Dewey-Humboldt website and mailed to current Town residents prior to the November 8th Election.

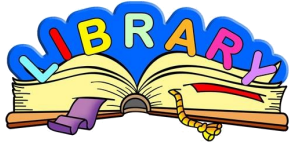

If you have a current library card from any of the [over 40 YLN libraries](#), you can use it at any Network Library that is open to the public.

Note: fines and policies vary from library to library in the Network. You are responsible for any materials checked out on your library card.

Library cards are free to Yavapai County residents. If you *don't* already have one and want to get yours from a District branch library, here's what you need to bring with you:

- A government or school-issued picture ID that has your current *physical* address.
 - If your ID has only a PO Box or an old address, you must also bring proof of current Yavapai County residency. Proof of local address could be:
- U.S. mail postmarked within the past 30 days
- current utility bill
- current rent receipt
- legal document
- current ID from an educational institution affiliated with the Yavapai Library Network

Children under 18 must have a parent or legal guardian register for them according to the guidelines above.
