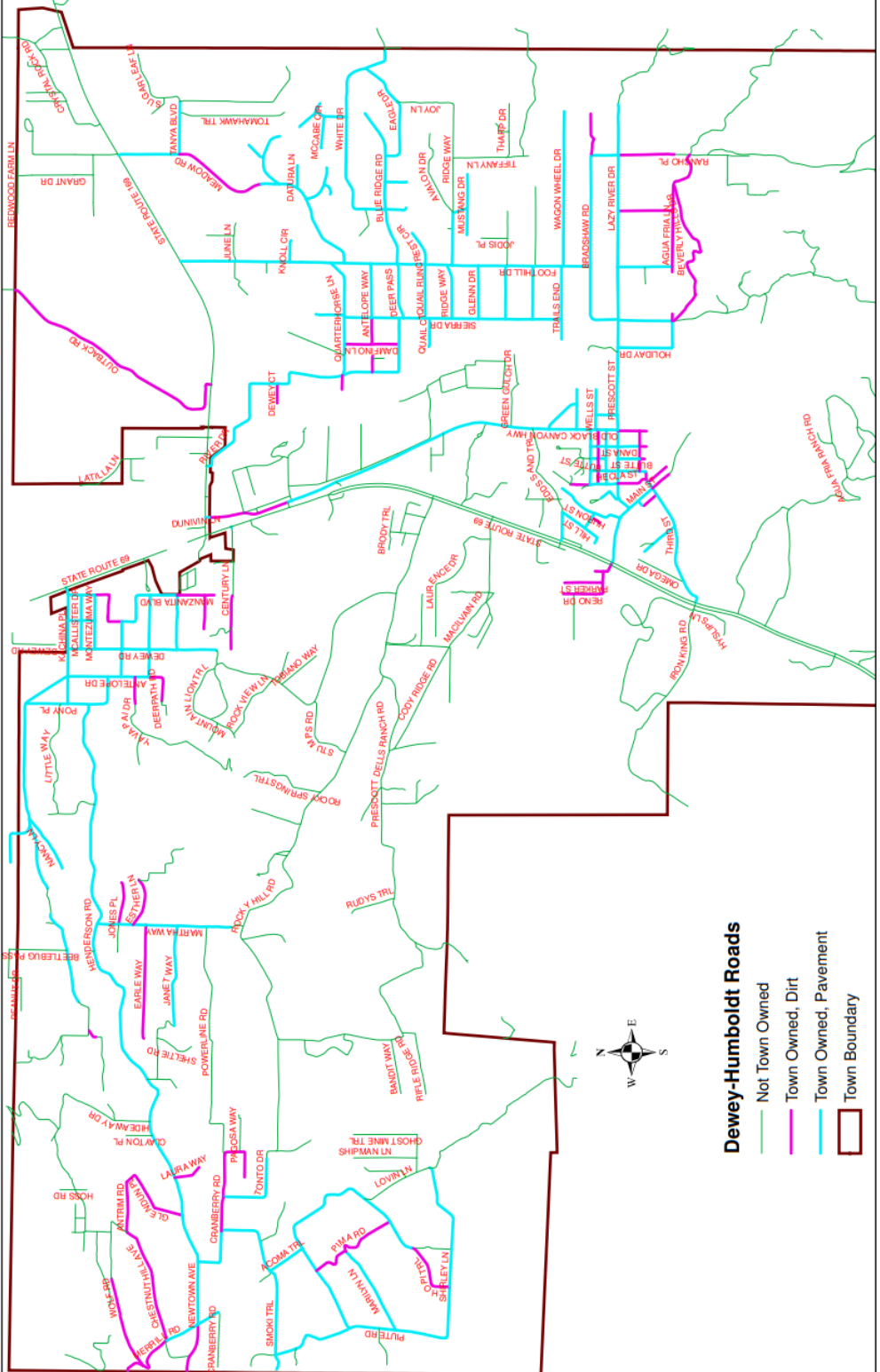

### alertYAVAPAI – YCSO

CodeRed is retired! AlertYAVAPAI will function much in the same way you are used to with CodeRed – sign up and receive alerts on multiple platforms – phone, email and text.

Yavapai County residents are encouraged to sign up for alertYAVAPAI, the new Emergency Mass Notification System that enhances YCSO ability to quickly communicate with the public and provide critical and time-sensitive information for emergencies such as wildfires, evacuations, floods and missing persons. By registering for alert YAVAPAI, you can receive alerts via cell phone by voice or text, email addresses, home phone, business phone, and more.

#### How Does It Work?

It will work in the same way CodeRed worked, by sending you alerts during an emergency or other need to know events. YCSO will continue to use the Ready, Set, Go alerts in reference to evacuations.

The system is easy to use, and the instructions for confirming messages will be included in the notification. If we do not reach you on the first attempt, the system may try another phone number or alternate method of communication, such as text messaging or email.

#### What Do You Need to Do?

**SIGN UP!** visit the [YCSOaz.gov](http://YCSOaz.gov) website. It's easy!

\* Text Alerts: You can opt in to receive text alerts. Just text alertYAVAPAI (all one word) to 888-777. You will then get a response that welcomes you to alertYAVAPAI, and then you will be asked to reply with your zip code to get area-based alerts.

\* EverBridge App: You can also download the Everbridge App (the orange picture is the App picture) and then search for Yavapai County or Yavapai County Sheriff's Office where you can sign up on the webpage and choose to receive notifications through the app.

The success of this service relies on YOU. Having your latest contact information is the only way to ensure that we can contact you in an emergency. It only takes about a minute to enroll!



### SNOW REMOVAL PLAN

In the event we receive heavy snow in the coming months, the snow removal plan is as follows:

Staff will start with the main collector/feeder roads throughout Town, then work into the smaller neighborhood roads. We will get to all Town owned roads as quickly as possible. The snowplow blade is wide, and the truck has to move slowly in order to effectively remove the snow. When snow removal is in process, there may be traffic delays on Town owned roads. Your patience would be appreciated.

During a snowstorm, we also ask our residents to avoid parking vehicles on the roads. Vehicles parked on the roads may become an obstacle for the Town's truck to remove snow.

### WINTERTIME SAFETY TIPS

#### Gas Fuel Appliances:

Change out air filters, check appliances for gas leaks and check out exhaust and combustible air ventilation systems. It is recommended to have a licensed mechanical contractor do a complete check-up on the gas heating system. A carbon monoxide detector is also a highly recommended device if you use gas-fuel appliances.

#### Smoke Alarms:

Replace the batteries and TEST the alarms to make sure they are in good working order.

#### Wood Stove/Fireplace/Pellet Stove:

Clean the flue/exhaust pipes regularly to ensure your appliances work more efficiently.

#### Doors & Windows:

Replace any worn out weather stripping around the doors and windows.
