alertYAVAPAI

Are you signed up for alertYAVAPAI? alertYAVAPAI is the new Emergency Notification System through Everbridge used by the Yavapai County Sheriff's Office. This system is used to send you time sensitive and critical information during emergencies in your area including wildfires, evacuations, floods, and missing persons. You can receive these important alerts through various options, including voice, text, and email to phone numbers and email addresses of your choice. If you haven't signed up, you can do so by:

- Texting alertYAVAPAI (all one word) to 888-777
- Downloading the Everbridge App (search for Yavapai County Sheriff's Office in the app) or
- visiting Home.YCSOAZ.gov

YAVAPAI COUNTY ONLINE DOG LICENSING

Take advantage of the free YCSO program and apply. Once an account is created the following tools are available:

- 1 Dog License: A 1-3 year license can be purchased. Licensing requirements may be viewed on the homepage.
- 2 Renewal: A license can be renewed. A license renewal can be paid for up to three years of the rabies vaccination period.
- 3 Dog Tag: The current Yavapai County dog tag is a permanent tag, which requires a yearly registration fee. An email notification will be sent after the due date.
- 4 Email Notifications: Receive email notifications on rabies vaccinations and licenses.
- 5 Co-guardianship: Dog owners can appoint secondary people for co-guardianship, which allows lost and found along with licensing and rabies notification.

To register an account, click on the 'Create a login' link in the left hand menu of the home page at [Home \(sheltertrack.com\)](http://Home.sheltertrack.com) and fill in the requested information.

For those without computer access, dog licenses may be purchased from humane societies, Sheriff's offices, low-cost spay and neuter clinics, and through the mail. ENCROACHMENT PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

When is an Encroachment permit required? The definition of Encroachment, as per the Town's Code of Ordinances, **Section 51.15**, states: **ENCROACHMENT.** Any obstruction (whether temporary or permanent, unless expressly authorized by law), any sign, any landscaping, any new driveway, any new other road connection, the diversion of waters, any excavation (whether or not conducted under a valid franchise), culvert installations (whether new or replacement), and any other construction on or within five feet of the greater of the **ROADWAY PRISM** or the **PUBLICLY MAINTAINED ROAD.**

PUBLICLY MAINTAINED ROAD is defined as the entire width of the right-of-way for any road under the exclusive control of the Town, whether held by deed, easement, dedication, or other claim of right, including bridges, and which have been included in the Town Road Maintenance System.

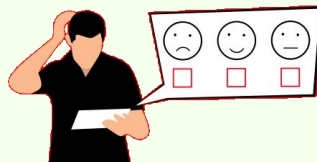

Know Before You Go and remember the following tips as you prepare to go out and cut your firewood:

Fire Season/Restrictions - Check <https://www.fs.usda.gov/prescott> for current information on fire restrictions.

- Ensure chainsaws have a functional spark arrestor. Bring water and a shovel in case of sparks.
- Pick up your free Motor Vehicle Use Maps (MVUM) from either PNF office.
- Make sure you have your MVUM, fuelwood permit and tags with you when you go to collect wood. Make sure to pack your personal safety supplies – such as water, snacks, first aid kit, etc.
