2022 VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR



Everyday Dewey - Humboldt volunteers generously give their time and service to help others. Now here is your chance to give back by nominating a deserving individual for his/her outstanding service through the Town's Volunteer of the Year program.

Who is eligible?: The nomination is open to all Dewey-Humboldt residents who have volunteered in 2022. Nominees need to have been volunteers as individuals or for organizations that directly benefit the citizens of the Town of Dewey-Humboldt.

Nomination Process: The process is simple. State the Nominee's name, what work has been done as a volunteer and/or the volunteer organization where the Nominee volunteered. Briefly describe why you believe the individual should be nominated, such as how his/her efforts volunteering in the specific organization have made a profound difference in citizens' lives. Each Nominee should be submitted on a separate form. Only one nomination per submission please. Nominations can be delivered to Town Hall via in person, U.S.P.S., emailed to bethevans@dhaz.gov or faxed to 928-632-7365. **The deadline for submissions is Thursday, June 30, 2023 at 5:00 pm.**

Honoree Selection: The Town Manager appoints a Citizen Committee to review the Nominees and make recommendations to the Town Council, who then decides whether to accept the recommendation. The Citizen Committee shall be comprised of a diverse group of individuals/organizations who are involved in the community. Members do not have to be a Dewey-Humboldt resident. Mayor John Hughes will be the Council's liaison with the Citizen Committee and will serve on the committee as an arbitrator only. Nominees will be judged on the outstanding service performed/donated by the nominee to the citizens of Dewey-Humboldt. This includes the amount of time and effort spent by the nominee; whether the nominee was nominated for more than one service; and, whether the nominee was nominated by more than one person for their service.

Recognition: The Honoree of the "Volunteer of the Year" Award, along with all that have been nominated, will be recognized by the Town Council at an upcoming Town Council meeting where they will be awarded certificates of appreciation. Nominees' guests and other dignitaries will be able to express their appreciation for the Nominee. The Volunteer of the Year plaque will be updated with the Honoree's name and date. This plaque is displayed in Town Hall. This is a wonderful way for the Town to express its sincere appreciation for our volunteers and a great opportunity for volunteers to inspire others through their stories.



COMMUNITY NEWS

WASHES, CHANNELS, DITCHES, CULVERTS, BRIDGES, & DRAINAGE EASEMENTS: KEEP YOUR WATERWAYS CLEAR!

Please **keep your waterways clear** to prevent clogged or plugged culverts. Homeowners have a responsibility to clean and maintain washes, drainage channels, and culverts running through their property. This means clean and clear of trash, debris, sediment, brush, overgrown choking or clogging vegetation, dead vegetation, and free of obstructions or structures.

Walls and no climb fences **should not** be placed where they cross washes. Stop walls at the edge of the drainage easement or the channels flood plain and leave the wash area as common open space. If this can't be done, flood gates should be designed by a professional.

Avoid locating any bridges, even decorated footbridges, over washes that originate upstream offsite from your property. Homemade or improperly designed or installed culverts and bridges can be disastrous for the homeowner, the neighbors, and adjacent streets. A culvert or bridge will generally alter the flow characteristics of the wash and should be designed by a professional.

Washes **must not** be filled in, plugged or altered in any way to prevent changing the flow of the waterways. The purpose of keeping these areas clean is to maintain an unobstructed conveyance of storm water without impeding or reducing the water carrying capacity of the wash or channel. Everything in the waterways rushes downstream.

If the culverts are clogged or homeowners have changed the flow of water on their property, this affects property owners below them causing flooding and property damage. Please think about how your waterways will affect your neighbors.

The citizens of the Town thank you! Additionally, **it is the property owner's responsibility to maintain driveways of rock and sediments entering the roadways.** Contact the Town of Dewey-Humboldt before beginning any work within the public right-of-way, as a permit may be required.

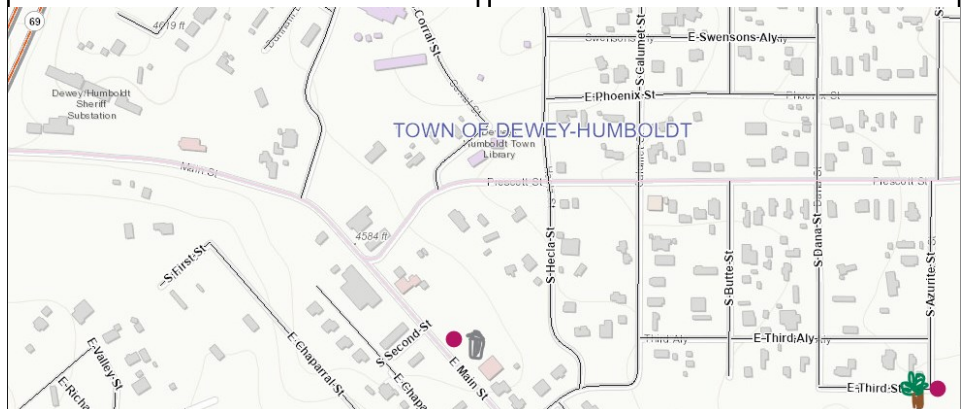

SPRING CLEAN UP

Starting on **Tuesday, May 30th**, and continuing through **Thursday, June 1st**, the Town will be accepting discarded items. Hours of operation will be from 8:00a.m. - 6:00 p.m.

There will be two locations, the **Town lot at 12938 E. Main St. and the Maintenance Yard at S. Azurite and E. Third St.**

At the **Maintenance Yard location**, we **will be** accepting the brush.

At the **E. Main St. location**, dumpsters will be available to handle your discards. Yard clippings, pine needles and horehound **will only** be accepted in trash bags. Items that **will not** be accepted are: tires; oils; hazardous chemicals; paint; refrigerators/freezers with freon/coolant canisters attached; household trash; and batteries.

Furniture (including mattresses), televisions and residential construction material (non-commercial), are all allowed.
