

EPA/ADEQ Schedule of Activities

April 2nd-4th

ADEQ will be surveying Chaparral Gulch and the Agua Fria for possible endangered species and historic preservation issues. EPA, on whose behalf ADEQ is doing the survey, must comply with both the Endangered Species Act (ESA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) in undertaking any remedial actions. ADEQ will be undertaking additional ESA and NHPA surveys in Town in coming weeks.

April 3rd-6th

EPA, led by Anne Lawrence, will have a team commencing door knocking in Town to secure consents to access properties.

April 10th-12th

EPA, again led by Anne Lawrence, will have two teams conducting door knocking in Town to secure consents to access properties.

April 13th

EPA, principally Anne Lawrence, will staff a table at the Dewey-Humboldt Days event to provide information about its residential soil project and to seek access agreements. Materials to be available at the table will be similar to those available at EPA's recent Open House.

April 22nd-26th

EPA intends to conduct residential soil sampling in Town, assuming it has sufficient access agreements to justify putting a sampling team in the field.
